## **The Evidence of Prediction**

### **Welcome & Prayer**

Good morning church! I want to welcome you to Park Chapel & to our new series, “**The Event**”. So, please join us over the next several weeks leading up to Easter as we examine the “Evidence” of our most reliable witnesses surrounding the Crucifixion of Jesus.

Today we’re are going to spend our time & study on “**The Evidence of Prediction**”, or “**Prophecy**”. But, before we do that, let’s spend some time in prayer before God.

Prayer...

### **Introduction: “Evidence & Doubt”**

(Jesus Sightings) etc...

On May 13 2006 Donna Lee was cooking a batch **easter pierogi**, and as she flipped one over she noticed burn markings that took on an image the image of Jesus. She saw Jesus in her Easter meal. She was moved by this for just a minute. She then placed her pierogi in the freezer and later that evening, put her item up for bid on ebay where it sold for a remarkable \$1775.00



A similar story happened in Miami Florida in 1994 when a woman was making a grilled cheese sandwich and after taking a bite into it notice what she called a vision of the Virgin Mary. She froze her sandwich and kept it for 10 years before selling it 2004 on ebay for a whopping \$28,000.00

You know we wrestle so much with doubt, that we find ourselves looking around every corner for evidence to support our faith.



**Evidence. Evidence. Evidence...** We love these shows on TV! Shows like “The Event”, “Bones”, “C.S.I.”, “House”... and the list could go on and on. These shows play to our human nature as skeptics. We doubt and so in that doubt, nothing pleases our minds more than “evidence” and “proof”.

You and I have two conflicting emotions that dominate our interpretation of any given event. **These conflicting emotions are “Faith” and “Reason”.** Some of you who may be new to christianity, have some major doorways of “doubt” to walk through.

“Isn’t the Bible just another book?” Doubt.

or, “How can a loving God give permission for suffering?” Doubt.

**And we who have been christians, for a number of years, know that, even in the middle of our ‘greatest days’, we live on this continuum of skepticism and doubt.** Difficult times come our way and we... doubt.

I want us to look at a small scene that includes Mary Magdalene, a girl who found herself in the “inner-circle” of Jesus’ ministry. Let’s watch her together and keep in mind our propensity for doubt.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, “They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.

John 20:1-2

Now let’s just stop right there. **Let’s begin to unpack this case study.** Because, what is happening? Mary has come and presented **physical evidence.** There’s an empty tomb.

And she has already come to some conclusions based on that evidence.

**Grave-robbing.**

Now let’s hang on. It’s not a ludicrous suggestion because during that time grave-robbing was a capital offense. It was possible, and to Mary’s reasonable mind, this is most likely what happened.

In contrast to this I want us to look at verse 8 and watch John,

“Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed.”

John 20:8

Now Danny will spend all of next week on “The Empty Tomb” but today we needed to peak in and see just this small scene and the contrasting reactions of Mary & John because they speak volumes into or own daily struggles with Reason, & Faith, and Doubt.

So as we study this “Event”, as we look into the the crucifixion & and the resurrection of Jesus over then next several weeks, and examine the evidence our prayers will be that you will be able to tap into the nature of personality of John who “saw and believed.”

## The Evidence of Prediction

Briefly today let’s take a look at The evidence of Prediction.

Throughout the life and teachings of Jesus we hear him saying... **“This was done so that the prophesy... would be fulfilled.”** So as you and I listen in and watch Jesus... in these historical narratives, we have to stop and take note of his **holistic awareness!** There is this beautiful poetry found in God’s word, the prophets, and in Jesus, ... who is called **The Word.**

So as...

\* John, “The Baptist”, says: **“Behold, the lamb of God!”** Jesus lives it.

\* Jesus studies **“Jonah, & the great fish”**, it’s deeper meanings reverberate.

So let’s explore prophesy for just a minute. **Look at this list.**

Listen to this scripture in Isaiah...

For I alone am God!

I am God, and there is none like me.

Only I can tell you the future

before it even happens.

Everything I plan will come to pass,

for I do whatever I wish.

I will call a swift bird of prey from the east—

a leader from a distant land to come and do my bidding.

I have said what I would do,

and I will do it.

So when it comes to **examining “The Evidence of Prediction”**, and our natural **inclination to doubt**, this **is** awesome! Prophecy is a great place to start our series: “The Event” What will you believe?

## In the Words of Jesus

Taking the twelve disciples aside, Jesus said, “Listen, we’re going up to Jerusalem, where all the predictions of the prophets concerning the Son of Man will come true. He will be handed over to the Romans, and he will be mocked, treated shamefully, and spit upon. They will flog him with a whip and kill him, but on the third day he will rise again.”

But they didn’t understand any of this. The significance of his words was hidden from them, and they failed to grasp what he was talking about.

Luke 18:31-34

Listen to this in Matthew 12...

For as Jonah was in the belly of the great fish for three days and three nights, so will the Son of Man be in the heart of the earth for three days and three nights.

Matthew 12:40

& In John...

But the Jewish leaders demanded, “What are you doing? If God gave you authority to do this, show us a miraculous sign to prove it.”

“All right,” Jesus replied. “Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.”

“What!” they exclaimed. “It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple, and you can rebuild it in three days?”

But when Jesus said “this temple,” he meant his own body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered he had said this, and they believed both the Scriptures and what Jesus had said.

John 2:18-22

**Bottom line:** What Jesus said would happen to him, happened.

Regardless of where you are on your spiritual journey, whether you are a “long-time” Christian who has lost interest in growing at all, or a “new vibrant” Christ follower who is looking for Jesus in every “grilled cheese” sandwich that you make, I want to close this morning with this question. “What are you putting your faith in?” Will you arrive **approach this “Event” like Mary** who’s

mind at that time couldn't comprehend the larger and more glorious ways of God. Her faith was in "common" sense. It wasn't bad, it was natural for her. She didn't know. Or will you **approach this "Event" like John**. You see John brings to this grave... a faith that can only come from God. Comfortably place your faith in the words of Jesus Christ. He not only said it, He did it, and He fulfilled it.

**In the Evidence of Prediction**, we know the prophecies of Jesus and his "**First coming**" but as the story continues today, many of those same Biblical prophets, including Jesus himself, tell the story of his **Second coming** as well. Let's be eagerly awaiting this day.
